VOCATION CORNER

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT:

"Therefore every vocation, even within the variety of paths, always requires an exodus from oneself in order to center one's life on Christ and on his Gospel. Both in married life and in the forms of religious consecration, as well as in priestly life, we must surmount the ways of thinking and acting that do not conform to the will of God."



We all have a vocation; it must be discerned through prayer and a willingness to sacrifice ourselves to the Lord's will for the success of our vocation.
